ACCESS: eJustice... bring legal practices into the e-age; Create online system for simple cases	Start discussion in legal profession
ACCESS: Cost/delay: McKenzie friends, “consultant” lawyers? (like HR Block)	Float options among profession/unis
QUALITY: Introduce extra qualifications for magistrates, judges: Devise “correction” systems	Grad Dips & Masters degrees; Like aviation crashes or medical errors
QUALITY: Measure the output-impact of magistrates, judges, and DPPs (qualitative and quantitative)	Partner with ‘measuring’ agency & uni
IMPROVE: 100-year review of basic laws, eg Crimes Act, for improved consistency (incl. bail, sentencing & parole guidelines, etc)	Achieve 1/100-year reform, plus alignment of core ‘principles’
IMPROVE: Implement ‘Freedoms’ recommendations by ALRC (incl. trafficked/slavery & juvenile Aboriginal); Charter of Rights in Tasmania & WA (after Qld)	Translate aspirations into reality; Protect the innocent & victims: Secure at least one more Charter of R
INNOVATE: Extend Right To Appeal law to all jurisdictions; Campaign for state/terr. Criminal Cases Review System, plus national	Create national + state + territory system for judgement-review externally
INNOVATE: Create rolling ‘Royal Commission’ into police forces; Address similar issues among security/crime agencies: ICACs/etc	Avoid endemic problems by regular external reviews, on rotation & select
IMPLEMENT: Sign up to OPCAT, then annual inspection of prisons Improve education in prisons to increase rehabilitation/reduce recidivism	Achieve legislation in all states/terrs. Develop e-prison programs
IMPLEMENT: Institute ‘Blue’ papers for any new police/security law for tabling in federal or state/territory parliaments (like ‘White/Green’ papers)	Give more time for MPs & Senators to analyse more robustly. 160101
